Joseph Kwadwo Asenso, PhD

D r. Asenso graduated with an MPhil degree in Economics from the University of Ghana after having graduated with BA Economics from the same institution. He was instrumental in the resuscitation of the Economic Planning Division of the Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning (MoFEP) when he joined in 2005. He is currently the Team Leader of the Knowledge Economy and Services Unit of the Real Sector Division, MoFEP, where he is involved in research, policy analysis and advice. He heads the Oil and Gas Unit at MOFEP. He worked briefly as a research assistant with the Venture Capital Trust Fund in 2007, on secondment from MoFEP, during which period he co-authored a proposal on alternative funding for the Fund. He went on to pursue a PhD in Economics at the Oita University, Japan, specializing in econometrics and monetary economics. He has authored and co-authored four books and a number of published articles in his areas of specialization.

GROW PROJECT

ACEP in collaboration with OXFAM executes grow project at four tertiary institutions in the Northern, Greater Accra, Ashanti and Brong Ahafo Regions. Speaking to students of the various institutions during this campaign, the Head of Policy Unit Dr. Ishmael Ackah said "The jubilee field has an expected time span of 25years. Already, Ghana has produced oil for 5 years. However, because oil revenues are spread thinly over many projects, little can be shown from the 3.2billion Ghana has received. Dr. Ishmael emphasized that ACEP is advocating for oil revenues to be invested into agriculture to ensure Ghana has food sufficiency, reduce import bills and use agriculture as basis for industrialization.

The GROW Campaign was executed at the University of

Development Studies in the Northern Region, Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology in the Ashanti Region, University of Renewable Energy in the Brong Ahafo Region and University of Professional Studies in the Greater Accra Region.
